County Handicraft Competition

Alderley District's 1st Handforth Cubs have proved themselves to be the county's 'craftiest' Cubs.

Their team of six boys and girls won the County Handicraft trophy in a competition held in Widnes.

The competition was also a real learning experience for the teams taking part who all had to make items for their own ShelterBox – using that charity's emergency relief materials as examples.

ShelterBox is an international disaster relief charity that delivers emergency shelter, warmth and dignity to people affected by disaster worldwide.

“It was very difficult to choose a winning team, but Alderley's representatives, 1st Handforth, did such a good job making the items for their box, and getting so much in it, that they deserved to be named as winner,” said Cubs' Assistant County Commissioner Cathy Bland.

A typical ShelterBox contains [mosquito nets](#), [collapsible water containers and water purifying equipment](#), [stove and cooking equipment](#), [custom-designed ten-person tent](#), [waterproof ponchos](#), [waterproof groundmats](#), [children's activity pack](#), [thermal fleece blankets](#) and a toolkit.

So far this year almost 68,000 ShelterBoxes have been shipped to countries in need of emergency aid including Chile and Haiti.

Chelford and Lindow "A" both progressed to the semis and safely navigated their way into the final for what was to be a closely contested match. The score see-sawed throughout the match but at the final whistle of normal time they were locked at 3 – 3, so the match went into "golden goal" extra time. Both teams pressed for the winner but neither could sneak the win and so the final went to the dreaded penalty shoot out. Again, there was very little to choose between the two teams, but the Chelford goalie saved Lindow's final penalty to earn Chelford a 2 – 1 penalty victory and take home the Cup.

Well done to Chelford for their victory and Lindow for their second place.
