Alderley Edge Explorers D of E Gold 2010 or Where there's a will there's a way

Having just recently become an assistant leader in the district, I must admit I was surprised to be asked to write an article for DIB so soon!

Our Expedition in August this year saw us trekking through the area around Edale, Ladybower Reservoir and Stannage Edge in the Dark Peak District. After an afternoon researching the local wildlife and history, we settled at base camp in Upper Booth ready for the next four days. Our aim was to investigate the diversity of flora and fauna around the various types of paths in the area, and see how the distance from the path affected this diversity. We took nearly 90 different samples at various heights and points along the route to obtain a general sample for the area. We had a mixture of weathers ranging from pouring rain to fog to full sunshine. The normal stuff.

However the background to our expedition was unusual, as we only thought about it when I returned from University in June so it was achieved in very short time. Our leaders and the new County DoE Advisor Carol Frain all encouraged us to give it a shot though many people told us it could not be done without a full year's planning. Through hard work we met all the deadlines for route and tracings submissions using every scrap of previous Bronze, Silver and Cheshire Hike experience. We completed our practice hike, still not having an assessor confirmed, but we kept going with our preparation anyway. A week before our actual hike, our assessor was confirmed – we had been sweating I can tell you!

We gained a lot of team working, communication, time management and organising things under time pressure experience. Even multi tasking! I fielded a phone call from the DoE assessor with route amendments at the same time as trying to cook a meal! And no it didn't get burnt.

I can't finish without saying a big thank you to the Alderley Edge Explorer team Karen, Peter and Judith and to Carol Frain. Without their guidance, encouragement and unwavering belief that we could do it, a bright idea by a few of us during a Scout Band practice would never have taken flight.



Since the beginning of September, band members have worked extremely hard preparing for two important competitions. On 12<sup>th</sup> September, the band members competed in the newly re-established Queen of the Moorlands Competition in Leek. Competing against 2 other bands, band members performed extremely well managing to come second, and awarded first place in Display. We were also awarded first place in Tuned Percussion, receiving a score of 96/100. Although the results were good, band members knew that a lot had to be improved upon before the next competition.

Exactly one week later, band members took part in Rubery Youth Marching Band Competition, competing against four other bands. After being awarded first place in both Wind and Display, as well as in Turnout and Tuned Percussion, the band managed once again to achieve Second Place. Although we received the same points finish as the previous week, the level of performance was hugely improved, and a credit to the quantity and quality of the work put in by band members during the previous week. The high point was when it was announced that we had the won the trophy for the 'Most Entertaining Band' out of the 10 bands taking part.

Currently the band is second in the league, having achieved a first and two second place finishes, and is in a great position to improve further. On Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> October the band is taking part in our "local" competition at Davyhulme in Manchester (George H Carnall Leisure Centre). We would welcome anyone who is in that area on the day to come and support us. Entry is free to spectators, and it does make a huge difference to have an audience cheering in your favour whilst you are competing.

I need a Night's Away Notification from anyone who is planning a night away/sleep-over, even if it is in your own Scout Hall.

If you would like to gain a Permit, please get in touch with me [janet.williamson@gmail.com](mailto:janet.williamson@gmail.com), so that we can have a chat and assess what sort of permit you are aiming for and how much experience you already have. It is advisable for you to attend the Night's Away Course (essential if you are new to Scouting) which is held once a year within the County. The dates for next year will be coming out shortly and places do get filled very quickly, so please apply as soon as the dates are available. Also, you need to get as much camping and sleep-over experience as possible.

If you do attend a course, please let Wendy MacDonald and I know, as we aren't always informed who attends.

Once you have attended a course and I am satisfied you have had enough practical experience, you then need to plan a camp/sleep-over, so that I can come and assess your capabilities. Afterwards, a short meeting to discuss the camp and then hopefully I can recommend you are issued with a Permit.
